Introduction

This conference was initially planned as a physical event at the University of the Witwatersrand in South Africa. This became impossible in the face of the COVID-19 pandemic. It will now be held virtually and further details on the technological modalities will be communicated to those selected.

Because of the pandemic, we have decided to extend the theme to also consider ways in which COVID-19 will potentially impact diaspora studies and engagements. Papers that consider this impact or examine the status of diaspora prior to the rise of the pandemic are welcome.

Abstracts of no more than 300 words covering the sub-themes listed below are invited. Given the current circumstances, we shall be happy to entertain initial and prospective thoughts and ideas.
